



## Sample Letter from Multiunit Housing Resident to the Office of Cannabis Management

To whom it may concern,

My name is [name] and I live at [property name] at [street address] in [city]. I am writing to express my urgent concern regarding the enforcement of a provision of Minnesota's new cannabis law that prohibits the vaping and smoking of cannabis products in multifamily housing.

Since adult-use cannabis became legal in 2023, I have been experiencing an increase in secondhand cannabis smoke infiltrating my home from neighboring units. I have faced significant health consequences from this exposure, and I am deeply concerned about the current lack of enforcement mechanisms in place to protect me and my neighbors. Studies show that secondhand marijuana smoke contains many of the same cancer-causing substances and toxic chemicals as secondhand tobacco smoke, including those linked to lung cancer. Unfortunately, these actions have not resolved the issue, and I have spent \$\_\_\_\_\_ of my own money trying to protect myself from the harmful effects of secondhand cannabis smoke.

This issue underscores an urgent need for the Office of Cannabis Management (OCM) to establish a clear and effective complaints and enforcement process for renters being harmed by secondhand cannabis smoke. We need prompt action to address these complaints and ensure

the OCM enforces this provision of the law. Without proper enforcement, the law's intent to protect residents from the dangers of secondhand cannabis smoke is not being realized.

I urge you to take immediate action to enforce the law. Specifically, I ask that you advocate for the OCM to create a robust complaints process and ensure timely responses to these serious concerns. Everyone deserves to breathe clean air in their own home and be free from the harmful effects of secondhand cannabis smoke.
